Dear Parents and Carers,

Another successful and busy week at Moorland. Our Year 2 and 6 pupils completed practice SATS assessments this week and made us all very proud with their resilience and positive attitude towards them. The progress they have made since their last practice has been really positive. Well done to all the children and thank you for continuing to support us in their learning.

Important Information about the MMR Vaccination

You may be aware that there has been a significant increase in the numbers of cases of Measles in certain parts of the country. Measles is very infectious and spreads easily between people who have not been vaccinated, especially in nurseries and schools. Measles is a serious illness. Some children with measles need to be admitted to hospital. Measles can cause pneumonia and inflammation (swelling) of the brain. Sometimes it can cause long term health problems or death. Measles is prevented by vaccination. Two MMR vaccinations provide excellent lifelong protection from catching measles.

We have sent you all a letter via email from the Director for Public Health, Milton Keynes Council about getting your child vaccinated against Measles, Mumps and Rubella. **This information applies if your child has never been vaccinated or has only had one vaccination**. If you are not sure about your child's vaccination status, please check their personal child health record (Red Book) or contact your GP surgery.

Please read the letter carefully and make sure your child's health and well-being is protected.

No Toys in School, please!



We would really appreciate if children didn't bring their toys into school, but kept them safe at home. Sometimes, we ask children to bring things to school for a Share and Tell learning experience. But it's such a shame if your child brings something in outside these occasions and the toy gets broken or lost or it causes problems between the children in the classroom.
