We invite all our pupils to wear colourful clothes and our very own school council will be baking and serving traditional Diwali biscuits!

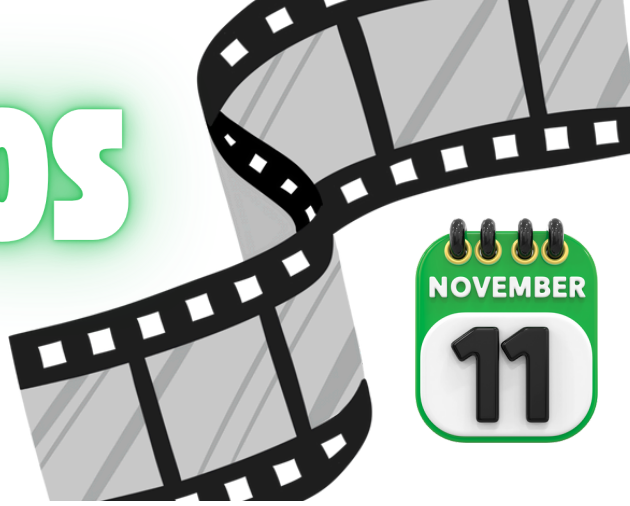
We're proud to celebrate the rich cultural diversity within our school and to give pupils the opportunity to learn from one another.

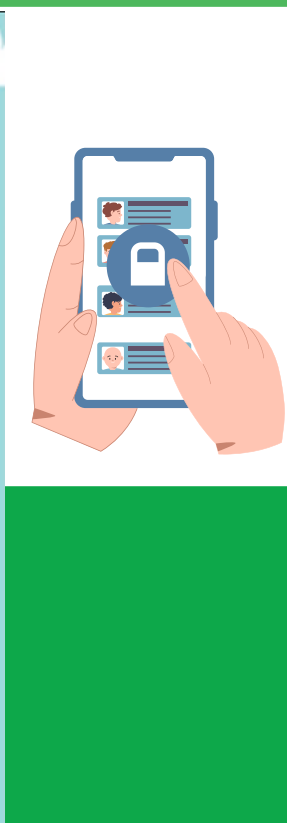


**Play - Protect - Ask - Say**
