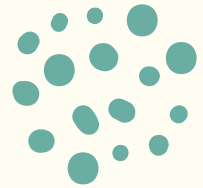

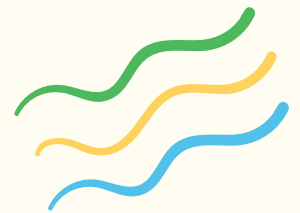

Grey trousers, skirt or pinafore dress (NOT jogging bottoms)

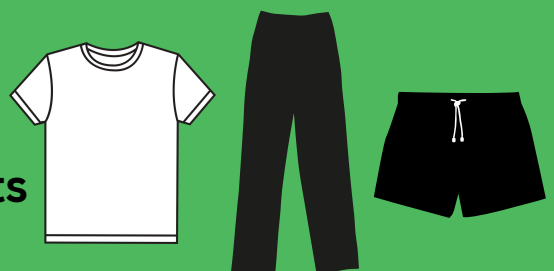
Black shoes (NOT trainers)

There has been an increasing number of children spending money online.

The persuasive design features on some online games and platforms are leading to experiences of financial harm.

Research revealed that 84% of parents have at least one parental control or way of monitoring their child's spending online, but 15% say they have no restrictions. Misleading features (such as drip pricing) and social influence features are said to have the highest impact.

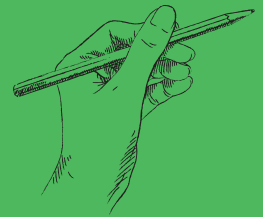
