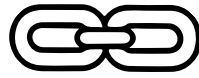
Enrichment passport

Mrs Carson

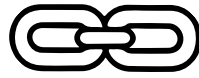
Who should tidy up the playground?

I think the children should tidy up after themselves - it will be quicker if everyone helps.


Mrs Bull

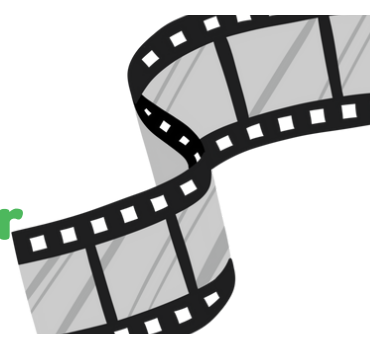
