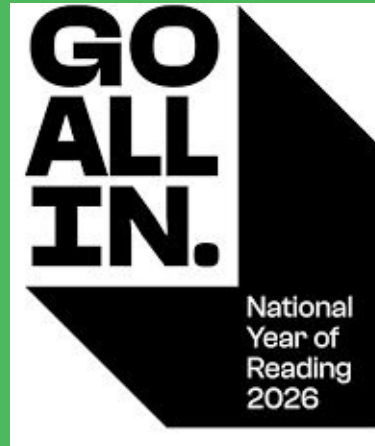

Despite being dressed in all sorts of outfits, this didn't distract from the focus on learning!

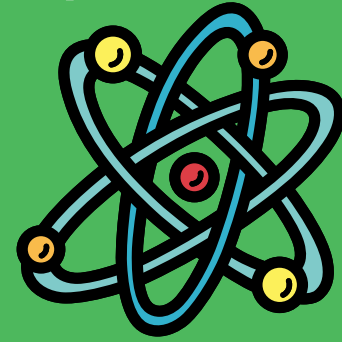

We are excited to host our very first Science Fair!

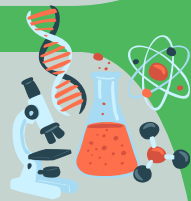
During the afternoon, all classes will visit the fair.

3:00–3:30pm: All parents welcome

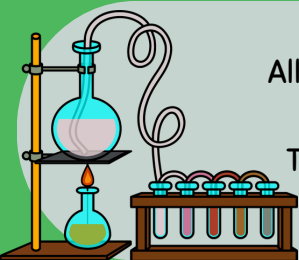
The top six entries will be invited to MKA on Friday to exhibit their work, where an overall winner will be chosen!



Friday 13th March: Science Workshops at MKA

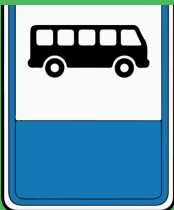
All pupils in Years 4 and 5 will walk to Milton Keynes Academy to enjoy two exciting science workshops.

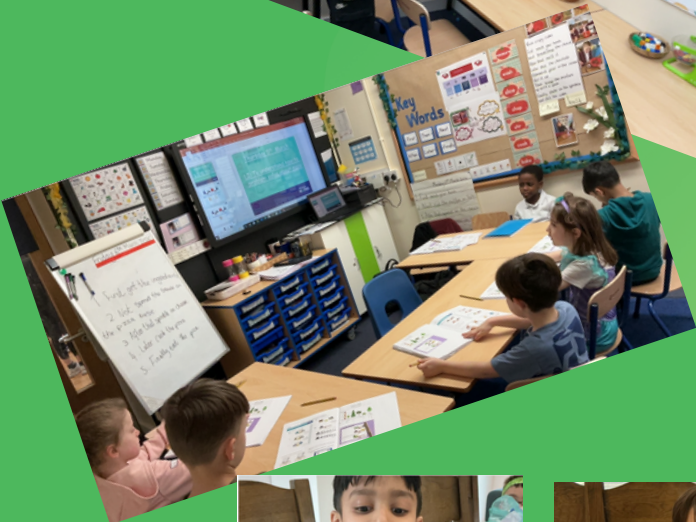



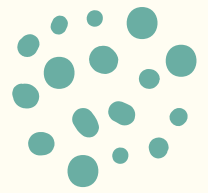
